#### 38. Farmhouse Fruit Cake using the following recipe:

#### Ingredients

225gms (8oz) self raising flour 125gms (5oz) butter or margarine 125gms (5oz) soft brown sugar 2 eggs 350gms (12oz) mixed fruit 1 tbs black treacle

1 tsp mixed spice /3 tbs milk.

**Method** Grease a 18 cm (7'') round cake tin and line with greaseproof paper. Preheat the oven to  $180^{\circ}\text{C}/350^{\circ}\text{F}/$  gas 4. Put the butter, sugar, dried fruits and spices in the bowl, and beat until combined slightly. Add the eggs and milk and beat for a few seconds, gradually add the flour and continue beating until well mixed. Pour into the cake tin and bake for about 11/2 hours. Cool in the tin for 15 minutes then turn on to a wire rack.

### 39. Courgette & Orange Cake with cream cheese frosting (Men only class) using the following recipe:

#### Ingredients

#### For the cake

350g (12oz) courgettes (no need to peel them) 200g (7oz) soft brown sugar 125ml (4fl oz) sunflower oil 3 large eggs, lightly beaten grated zest 1 orange 1 tsp vanilla extract 100g (4oz) sultanas 300g (11oz) self raising flour 1 tsp baking powder

For the frosting

200g (7oz) full-fat cream cheese 100g (4oz) icing sugar, sifted good grating of orange zest **Method** STEP 1 Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Lightly oil and line a 1kg loaf tin with a strip of baking parchment. Finely grate the courgettes, then squeeze out as much liquid as you can with your hands (too much will make the cake soggy).

STEP 2 Stir the courgettes with the sugar, sunflower oil, eggs, orange zest, vanilla and sultanas, then fold in the flour and baking powder until they disappear, but don't overmix.

STEP 3 Scrape the mixture into the tin and bake for 50 mins until a skewer inserted into the cake comes out clean. Remove from the tin and cool on a wire rack.

STEP 4 Meanwhile, beat the cream cheese with the icing sugar (don't overbeat as this can make the mixture too soft), then chill. Spread over the cooled cake, scatter with the zest and chill until ready to serve. Will keep for a week in the fridge.







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
