NATURE NOTES from Brenda Mace

We saw 7 red kites soaring around on the thermals, at Saint John's bends, during the hot spell of weather, It went downhill from there, rain and cold.butterflies very few and far between the Buddleia should be smothered with butterflies, but nothing. Several people have said their vegetables are not doing well, due to the lack of pollinating bees and insects. The only thing doing well is the lawn. On the 22nd of June I saw my first Turtle Dove at 5.30 am. I watched it for a few minutes and hoped that it has a mate back this year. We have had a family of Goldcrests for quite a few weeks hunting about in the conifers. They are not a shy bird so you can get quite close to them and they are happy to stay around. I'm glad to see there are more Kestrels in the area, there is a pair in the High Street, I saw them displaying to each other in the spring, and hope they are nesting here this year. The blackberry bushes in the hedgerows are covered with blooms, more than I've seen for a long timelet's hope there are enough insects to pollinate them, jam and crumbles depend on them! Alastair and I have seen an Egret several times sitting by its pond, it's not a Little Egret as it is larger, it could be a Cattle Egret, If anyone is any the wiser we would like to know....
